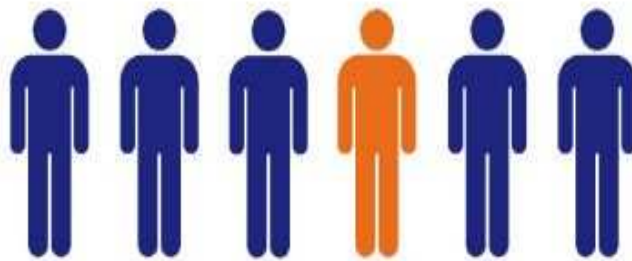


'Named GP' for all patients

Last year '**named GPs**' were introduced specifically for patients aged over 75. As from April 2015, **all** patients must have a 'named GP' within the Practice.

Our patients register with the practice as a whole and not with a specific doctor but we have allocated everyone to a named GP according to letters of the alphabet.



If your surname begins with the letter **A—L**, your 'named GP' will be **Dr Drury**.

Patients whose surname begins with the letter **M—Z**, have **Dr Kirkaldy** as their 'named GP'.

Named GPs have overarching responsibility for the care the Practice provides. The role exists to make sure there is a named individual you can go to should you need it.

Although you have been assigned a particular named GP, this need have no effect on who you see. You can still choose to book an appointment with any nurse or GP you choose.

If you'd like to change your named GP for any reason, just ask reception.
